Homeland security, emergency management, cybersecurity law and policy, critical infrastructure, unmanned aerial systems.

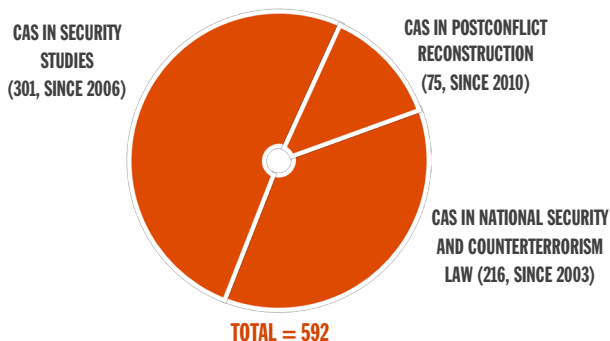

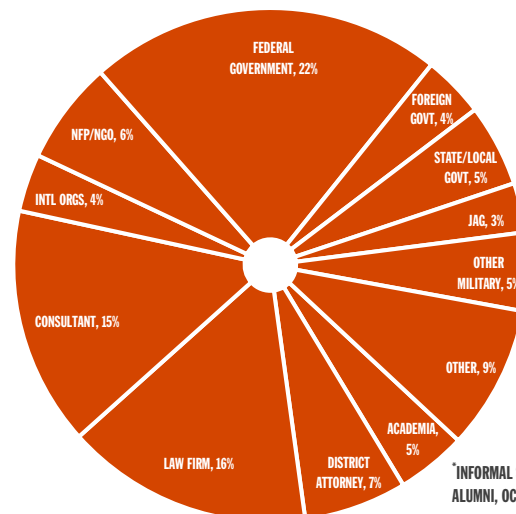
